ARCHAEOLOGY

The Center for Public Archaeology has existed for 18 years at the California State University, Northridge. The Center was created to meet several needs. Those needs include student training in archaeology, advancement of research in California archaeology, and consulting with public and private agencies in meeting regulatory requirements related to archaeological resources. This site describes the Center and some of the service-learning projects that students have been involved in, such as archaeological resources surveys, archaeological excavation, preparation of environmental impact statements, and zooarchaeological research.

The Mesa Southwest Museum, a local museum with a focus on history, anthropology and natural history has been an archaeology service-learning site for students from Mesa Community College. Students assist with the archaeology lab, excavation sites, and exhibition preparation at the museum. They also help with education departments, paleontology and anthropology areas.
