Terms of Payment

The Fall Term shall be considered as the first half of the year and the Winter/May Terms as the second half.

An advance statement of preliminary costs for the Fall and Winter Terms, along with any related financial aid, will be mailed to students before each term begins. The net balance (i.e., charges minus related financial aid) is considered past due after Oct. 9, 2009, for Fall Term, and Feb. 10, 2010, for Winter/May Term. Charges over 30 days old are subject to a finance charge. Checks should be made payable to Wartburg College and mailed to the Controller's Office.

Room

Housing assignments are made by the Residential Life Office after students complete and return a housing application and make the \$100 pre-enrollment/housing deposit. All listed room costs are at least double occupancy. A limited number of single rooms are available for an additional charge.

Board

All students living in campus residences are required to eat in the Mensa (cafeteria) unless an exception is granted by the Director of Dining Services and the Vice President for Student Life. Meal plans are charged at the full amount, with any unused points rolling from one term to the next, through May Term. Any unused points at the end of May Term are nonrefundable. A special six-meal plan applies only to Knights Village residents.

Books and Supplies

Books and supplies for all courses may be purchased at the college bookstore. Average book costs for September through May are approximately \$1,000.
