

2010-2011 Verification Worksheet

Your FAFSA application was selected for review in a process called "Verification." The law says we have the right to ask you for this information before awarding federal aid. If there are differences between your application information and your financial documents, we may need to send corrections electronically to have your information reprocessed.

What you should do

- Collect your and your parent(s)' financial documents (signed 2009 federal income tax forms, W-2 forms, etc.)
- Complete this worksheet. **ALL SECTIONS MUST BE FILLED IN.** Write N/A (not applicable) or enter a zero if the field does not pertain to you. You and at least one parent **MUST** sign the worksheet.
- Send or take the completed worksheet, plus copies of your and your parent(s)' signed 2009 federal tax forms and 2009 W-2 forms to the Financial Aid Office at Wartburg College.

We must review the requested information under the financial aid program rules (CFR Title 34, Part 668).
